Thefts from motor vehicles happen throughout the city on a regular basis and are typically occurring on vehicles which have been left unlocked.  - Darlene spoke about parking issues on Prospect Boulevard, citing that cars block sidewalks.
 - Jeanne asked about the city putting in ADA ramps all across the city. Lauren will follow up.
 - Hayden inquired about leash laws being enforced.
 - Denise brought up dirt bikes riding/racing/popping wheelies up and down Carrollton Drive. CPL Sparks advised to keep calling the non-emergency line when seen but that their hands are pretty much tied.



- Cheryl discussed cars being parked the wrong way on Carrollton Drive.
- Eva informed us that she saw a person going around checking car doors to see if they were locked.
- CPL Sparks could not emphasize enough that everyone **MUST LOCK THEIR CAR DOORS.**

- Featured Guest: Derby Swanson, Community Engagement Manager for Habitat for Humanity of Frederick County
 - West All Saints Rehab Project & Groundbreaking
 - Swanson gave a presentation that included an overview of Habitat for Humanity, its humble beginnings and how it has expanded since its founding in the 1940's.
 - After the overview, she went over the specific project on Ice Street and West All Saints, including rehab of existing building and new construction outlining the different phases.
 - Home Repair Program
 - Next, Swanson shared that Habitat for Humanity also does home repairs for county residents aged 60 and older that have lived in their home for at least a year and plan to continue staying in their home for the next 3 years. This is grant-funded and the funds need to be utilized by the end of May 2023. Ms. Swanson requested that we disseminate this information for any 60+ year old homeowner meeting the criteria to reach out for these funds to be used before May. If not used, the funds will be lost.
 - Swanson spoke for a few minutes about the ReStore that is run by Habitat for Humanity whose proceeds directly benefit this non-profit. This is a store consisting of donated excess building materials and slightly used household items on 9th and East Streets in Frederick.

SUGGESTIONS & COMMENTS / MISC:

- Glo Fiber Covers Unsecured - Denise brought up dealt with covers over Glo Fiber fiber optic cables not being secure, leaving dangerous conditions for neighbors on Carrollton Drive, Prospect Boulevard and Willow Drive. Lauren stated that she would check with the Department of Public Works and/or Code Enforcement to find out who deals with this issue because Glo Fiber is installing these underground cables all over the city and need to be more careful to secure the covers after installation.
